

## A prayer

Thank you, Lord, for the gift of Easter, reminding us of your boundless love and grace. Change our lives, change our hearts to be messengers of Easter joy and hope. We make our prayer through Jesus Christ, our risen Lord forever. Amen.

## Can we be positive during these challenging times?

This question often troubles Christians, especially when they are struggling with their own challenges and see so much ugliness around the world. Recently I have been 'grounded' at home prior to a visit to hospital and the subsequent recuperation. I haven't found it easy, even my beloved reading has been a struggle! I feel like I have been on a roller coaster of emotions, from being quite depressed about what we see happening in the world and our own country and then being so grateful personally for all the blessings we have. I have had occasions when I've been prompted to reflect upon how I look at things and what I concentrate on each day. So, I felt I should share some of these thoughts with you.

Firstly, I don't know how many of you watch the Channel 4 programme called '**Love it or list it**'? It is where Kirsty Allsop and Phil Spencer help couples decide whether they are going to sell their home and move to a larger or more suitable property, or alternatively do some major alterations to meet their current needs in their existing home.

As I recently watched an episode where a beautiful 'kitchen diner' extension had been constructed, I saw in front of me a beautifully painted quote on one of the walls. It was "*In everything give thanks*" – I initially thought it was a somewhat unusual quote to be on a kitchen wall, but quickly realised how appropriate it really was. It comes from Paul's comment at the end of his first letter to his friends in Thessalonica. (1 Thess 5.18). Even when we do feel surrounded by challenges, some of which seem insurmountable, we must acknowledge that we really do live a privileged life in an area of the world with so many resources to help us, as opposed to so many folk who struggle for the very basics of life. I thought this when I observed some of the amazing resources being used in the Royal Derby Hospital recently, where those exceptionally dedicated medics helped so many with their health struggles.

On another occasion I was reading one of Paul's letters, my favourite, the one to his Philippian friends, where he said: "And now, dear brothers and sisters, one final thing. Fix your thoughts on what is true, and honourable, and right, and pure, and lovely, and admirable. Think about things that are excellent and worthy of praise." (Phil 4:8.)

Oh boy! That's so difficult isn't it when we are surrounded by so much negativity, inequality, racism and evil? It seems wherever we look, be it Ukraine, Gaza, Haiti, or our own country we see so much ugliness. But then, without 'burying our heads in the sand' to the reality which exists, Paul is encouraging us to lift our eyes up, and refocus on the positive, true, pure, lovely and admirable things we can see and appreciate. Some may say, "there isn't much evidence of that around me", well, I have been bowled over by so much kindness I've observed recently, simple acts of love and consideration shown to me and others in recent days, which has made my heart glad.

It's true that what we concentrate on has such an influence on our attitudes and outlook. Those who look for good are motivated to get involved with good things and those who concentrate on what's wrong and evil can soon become overwhelmed by negativity.

Paul encourages us to reflect that what we think about really makes a difference. I felt I could really relate to a simple analogy someone shared with me recently, it was a picture of a pathway through the woods; the more we walk along it the clearer and wider it appears, and it becomes easier to walk along. But if we stop using the path it would become overgrown with weeds and brambles and be more difficult to access.

That's what happens with our thought patterns. It appears to me that we have a deliberate choice! The more we think about something repeatedly the more it influences our thought processes. Toxic negative and critical thoughts can so easily overpower our thinking and make that particular 'pathway' wider and more natural. But actively looking for the positive examples and the good things around us makes *that* alternative pattern of thinking more natural, leaving the negative one to become overgrown and more difficult to find.

With the Holy Spirit's help, replacing negative thoughts with positive ones will gradually mean we'll find ourselves walking a path that is transforming and renewing – not only to our minds but also to our lives and our health!

Finally, just before Paul's above exhortation he says "*Don't fret or worry. Instead of worrying, pray. Let petitions and praises shape your worries into prayers, letting God know your concerns".* Phil 4. 6. (The Message)

These thoughts have certainly made me think and challenged me as to what I read, what I watch and how I allow my thoughts to wander or concentrate on, bringing all my concerns before the Lord. I hope it's prompted you to examine how you allow your thoughts to focus too!

## Revising the Electoral Roll at St John's.

If you have changed address in the last year or have been part of the worshipping community at St John's for 6 months (or more), then please fill in an Electoral Roll Form and return it in a sealed envelope addressed to the Electoral Roll Officer (Andrew Templer), or hand it directly to one of the Church Wardens (Ray or Richard).

The deadline for return of these forms is 14th April

The Electoral Roll is a list of people who support the Church, both by attendance and financially. Being on the Electoral Roll allows you to vote at the up-coming Annual Church and Parish Meetings (this year on 19th May) when we elect officers and other representatives of our Church as well as sharing the Annual Report and Accounts for the previous year.

<u>Please note:</u> all forms of this nature are stored securely by the Electoral Roll Officer and the information is only shared within the Church Management Group (Ministry Team and Co-ordinators).

Annual Parish & Church Meetings (APCM) 19th May - 11.30am. We will be electing a new Churchwarden (Richard is stepping down after 3 years in this role) and we need at least 4 new members for the PCC. Please consider prayerfully whether **you could** serve St John's as a PCC.member - it's good to have a variety of opinions on the topics we discuss. (The usual term is 3 years - but some vacancies are for less time)

The PCC meets every two months for a couple of hours in the evening - usually 3rd Wed of the relevant month.

But there is more than one way of worshipping God. Astronomers approximate the existence of hundreds of billions of galaxies, more than ten galaxies for each person alive today! So, you won't run out of things to do in heaven, and it certainly won't be boring. It has taken thousands of years for billions of humans to explore a single tiny planet, and we have barely scratched the surface. Exploring the marvels of the new heavens and the new earth will keep us intrigued forever. And our love for God will grow infinitely bigger as a result. So, we will never cease to worship Him. Jesus told the woman at the well that God is looking for those who 'worship...in the Spirit and in truth' (John 4:23 NIV). If you worship out of ignorance, worship is empty. God doesn't just want you to worship Him; He wants you to know who you are worshipping and why you are worshipping Him. Worship is twofold: 'in the Spirit and in truth'.
