Susie writes



DERBY CITY DEANERY: ROOTED IN PRAYER

Take a moment to listen to the still small voice of God within the bustle of the day which has begun. Find a quiet place where you can enjoy precious moments of peace in God's presence. Sit quietly and listen to the sounds of the world around you, both outside and in the place where you are. Breathe slowly and rest in God's presence.....

The heavens declare your glory, the skies exalt your name, and though no anthems are sung, no sermons written or candles lit, within the beauty of dawn's breaking chorus, sun rising, stars at night, lies more theology than any hymn that we could sing. So we behold your glory, and in our hearts join with the heavens in rejoicing.

Spend a moment or two to reflect on God's impact on your life. The things you say and do today will have an impact on all those you meet, it's unavoidable! How is that fact going to influence how you approach this day?

You have called us to be your people, to follow where you lead, be obedient to your word and bring your Good News wherever we might go. Forgive the impatience and lack of faith which causes us to stumble; when we prefer our way to yours. Draw us back into your arms, as prodigals to their Father and grant us patience and perseverance in our journeying with you.

Consider these words and how they apply to your experience of God:

Because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of His Son into our hearts, the Spirit who calls out, 'Abba, Father.' (Galatians 4:6)

Remind us often, Lord that we are chosen to share the good news, and point the way to you.

Remind us often, Lord that in our labours we can show your love in everything we do

Remind us often, Lord that we are chosen to live by your Word and reveal your glory!

Welcoming Samuel Ojok.

Samuel has recently started working for the DBF as part of the Parish Support Office. His role is Diocesan Environmental Engagement Officer. Samuel has over 8 years of experience in managing both agriculture, environment and agribusiness programmes in the African context. Now with us at the Parish Support Office, he will be focused on championing the Eco Church Scheme with churches and schools, to become greener and carbon free by 2030 with support from the National Church of England in partnership with A Rocha UK.



He will provide overall coordination and leadership on the A Rocha Eco Diocese Award Scheme; promote and develop the A Rocha Eco Church and School Award Scheme to achieve bronze, silver and gold awards; establish a team of volunteer environmental advisors and advocates to further the work of the diocesan environmental action; lead, develop and manage the Caring of God's Acre work which supports groups and individuals to investigate and care for burial grounds; lead develop and manage the annual collection of data through the Energy Footprint Tool; advocate and champion for environmental issues across the diocese, keeping to date with the work of national environmental organisations and charities; speak and teach in churches and church groups to encourage a practical response to the call to cherish creation, cut carbon and speak up and finally to work with others to develop prayer, worship and other resources for local church communities and groups.

The missional purpose


To support anyone who feels called to establish

Greenhouse in the Diocese

There are currently two Deaneries in the Diocese which have Greenhouses, Mercia and Derby City. The aim is to have one in every Deanery in the Diocese to make the most of the relationships in each one. Further supporting this through occasional Diocesan Greenhouse gatherings like the Mission in the Mixed Ecology conversation with Michael Moynagh in October 2023.

For Derby City Greenhouse, it first met in August 2023 at 'Space on Sunday' in Allenton. Then again in May 2024 at 'Gather' in the Infinity Garden Village when the teams met for an informal afternoon tea. Messy Church, Warm welcome, over 55's residential, monastic community, new housing, meals with friends and foodbank spaces all participating in missional journeys connecting with new people who do not know Jesus. The teams sharing with each other, generating new ideas, reinforcing sustainable ones and growing their respective spaces and the opportunity for new people to find and follow Jesus. Our next meeting in is in September and you are welcome.
