Talk (based on James 3: 1 to 12)

How do we judge whether someone is telling the truth?

We make judgements every day, about sports people, about politicians, about friends, neighbours. In the world in which we live, a post on Instagram can go viral. A report in a newspaper, or an item on the news, or on the radio can equally change opinions in a flash.

But there is something especially powerful about speech. My Great Aunt Lena was old enough to be a Guide in the late 1930s and she went to Germany. Her group were taken to a stadium and she heard Adolf Hitler speaking.

Although her German was not fluent, she understood enough from the way the crowds were responding to his ranting that they hung on his every word. He had the crowd as we say, 'in the palm of his hand'. They believed everything he said. What was her reaction? She was extremely disturbed, because her German hosts accepted his ranting about Jews and about Gypsies as the truth.

People who have the power of oratory, who can make fine speeches, can use their skill for good, or for evil.

The same goes in the Church. Preachers who have that skill to speak to a crowd are sometimes idolised, I'm thinking Billy Graham, or Martin Luther King. But even if someone has a great reputation, when we listen to them, are we persuaded, are we carried along with the crowd, can we discern whether what they say is true, or not?

A much wiser person than me, once said to me. 'You need to test the spirits.' He was quoting 1 John 4 where Jesus' best friend wrote: 'Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but **test the spirits** to **see** whether they are from **God**, for many false prophets have gone out into the world. ² By this you know the **Spirit** of **God**: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from **God**, ³ and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from **God**.

One of the ways in which I test the spirit of the person I am listening to, is how they speak about other people. If they run someone else down to big themselves up, then what they are saying is definitely not from God. If however they speak words of encouragement, and grace alongside challenge, then the odds are they are speaking the word of God to us.

James in his epistle is warning his readers to watch what they say. A tiny spark can lead to a huge fire. Speaking ill of others for no good reason, to make ourselves appear better, will only sow dissension and is contrary to the building up of the body

of Christ. If that kind of talk comes out of someone's mouth all the time, then it needs challenging.

As James puts it: ⁹ With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God's likeness. ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be. ¹¹ Can both fresh water and salt water flow from the same spring?

Jesus addressed the same issue by saying: A good person brings good things out of the good stored up in their heart, and an evil person brings evil things out of the evil stored up in their heart, for the mouth speaks of what the heart is full of.

Truth matters, but Grace matters too. Jesus Christ was a man full of grace and truth and that is something that all of us that have a ministry of speaking need to remember and try to emulate.

Whether our calling in the Kingdom is to speak, or to serve in some other capacity, how we treat others is a mark of how much we have been changed on the inside. We are to be people who not only speak truth with grace and love, but also demonstrate that by how we live:

Loving the Lord our God with all our heart soul and mind and loving our neighbour as ourself. Simple, isn't it?
