Editors Scribbles!

Welcome to the October 2024 edition of News and Views Magazine, which is, as always, crammed full of news, updates, reminders and information.

I saw an article last weekend and it was about Bible Sunday, and the relevance of why we should read the bible, I found it very interesting and thought I would share it with you all!

‘As Bible Sunday is celebrated this month on October 27th, let’s ask why we should read the Bible?

The Bible isn’t a single book, but a library of 66 books, composed by some 44 writers over 1500 years in a range of styles including history, poetry, prophecy, letters and apocalyptic (looking the end times). Despite having a number of different writers, it claims one authority - God Himself! ‘All Scripture is God- breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work’ (2 Timothy 3:16). The Bible is inspired (‘the word of God in the words of men’) and equips us to live for God in every aspect of our lives. We also have the promise of the Holy Spirit to guide us when we read: ‘when the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all truth’ (John 16:13).

How should we read the Bible? Let’s consider the following guidelines:

Right time: We need a regular routine, which will meet our needs. This will vary according to our circumstances e.g. a mum at home with young children, somebody with a demanding job or a retired person.

Right Place: We need to find a space where we can be undisturbed (e.g. lounge, bedroom, train or kitchen).

Right Version: We need a version of the Bible which we can readily understand and use. A number of versions are available (e.g. NIV, The Message), as well as Bible apps we can access on our phone.

Right Help: Reading notes also help us to understand a passage and apply it to our lives.

Let’s get reading!!

Is it really September?

The answer quite definitely is 'yes' as many of us have been taking advantage of cheaper prices and less crowds to go on holiday (that will include Helen and I as we take our summer break at the end of September and the first week of October).

Looking back, it has been a busy summer. Internationally there has been the Olympics and the Paralympics. The weather has been mixed but as I write this, we are basking in a forecast week of sunshine – maybe not quite an 'Indian summer' but pretty good nevertheless.

In our gardens, tidying up is taking place. Pruning back shrubs and hedges and dead-heading Dahias or Cosmos, so that we might get a few more weeks of colour, before they all come out to be replaced by pansies! Of course the most obvious thing is that the evenings are drawing in, and switching on the central heating is occasionally needed.

But behind the leaves falling, the buds for next year's leaves are growing, and the below the bare earth next spring's bulbs are already coming to life. It always amazes me how early they begin to show again. But this is also a sign to us of God's good grace towards his planet. The seasons remind us that despite our worst endeavours, nature will respond to the shortening of the days, the cooler weather and the inevitable rainfall.

You may not have noticed in the news reports, but the climate is definitely changing. The Sahara has received the biggest dump of rain in living memory, flooding towns and settlements where people live in mud huts, which of course collapse under the pressure of the rain. The floods in Central Europe, could so easily have been over us. And that is why we need to continue to make costly changes in our lifestyles. However depressing the shortening of days between now and December, we know that the days will lengthen again, seeds will sprout and spring up bringing their harvest next year.

And what of the church's year? Harvest will soon be upon us – 29th @ All Saints, 13th October @ St Andrews, and 20th October @ St Johns. Harvest reminds us to be thankful, that despite our challenges, we continue to enjoy food to eat and water to drink.

I was very struck by the most recent set of statistics regarding poverty in Derby. Over 20000 adults and over 13000 children had to be regularly helped by food banks across the City in this last 12 months. That is about 14% of the population of the city of Derby. The total cost is over £500k. Local charities are facing the winter very low on food and provisions and indeed on financial reserves. So, let us all be as generous as we can, and not only now, but also in the colder months too.

There is a food pantry based in the old school rooms on the parade here in Mickleover. Any excess food is taken to other food banks across the city. Do let friends and neighbours know, and encourage them to donate.

It is also the time of year when we look at all our churches charitable giving. St Johns and All Saints have long had a policy of tithing from our income. The PCCs are considering which charities we should support. If you have suggestions or would like to join a small group that reviews the list of charities, please let the Treasurers or any of the clergy know.

That is followed by Remembrance (10th November) – did you know that Mickleover is the only parade that happens in Derby other than the one in the centre of town? That has come about because of the fund raising that has taken place to pay for the event management company that will keep us all safe on the march. Each year between £1500 and £2000 is needed to be raised. That includes paying for insurance against accidents etc. This year's theme is 'D-Day 80 years on.'

A choir from the local primary schools will be taking part, and there will hopefully be slightly less stress this year as the turret clock at All Saints has been automated during the summer and strikes bang on the hour (A huge thank you to all those volunteers over the years who have gone up the ladders twice a week to wind the clock up – you can take a well-earned retirement!)

And then the run into Christmas. Our Mickleover's Christmas Fete is on Sunday 24th November, starting with Churches Together Christmas Carols at 4pm at All Saints, supported by Newmount Brass Band.

As a clergy team we are looking at how we can have a more reflective afternoon advent service during December at St Johns, before we get into the usual round of carol services across all three churches – more details to follow.

Please be praying for the Readers and Clergy and for everyone who volunteers week by week in support roles. It is very easy to get discouraged amidst the busyness. I always give thanks to God when the Rotas are completed for the following month, but it is always a real juggling act to accommodate everyone's availabilities.

Finally, we worship and serve a loving Lord who continues to watch over all of us and encourages us to look to him for guidance. These are his Churches, not ours. He has led us all in the past, and he will lead us all in the future. Our job is to listen and to obey, and at the same time be kind to one another as we serve Him.

May all the glory go to God. Amen! *Every blessing. Peter*

'The ingredients of a Miracle When the Wine Ran Out'

"There was a wedding in Cana of Galilee."

John 2:1 NKJV

In Jesus's first miracle of turning water into wine, it is very revealing to understand some principles of how he can work in our lives.

- 1) Firstly '...Jesus and His disciples were invited' (vv. 1-2 NKJV). When the problem of the wine running out arose, this couple didn't have to send for Jesus because He was already there. Not only did they know Him, but they had also included Him in their plans. They honoured Him. The cry of Paul's heart was 'that I may know Him' (Philippians 3:10 NKJV). Why? Because when we know the Lord, we can call on Him with confidence and can be assured He will be by our side when we need Him. This couple probably had a long time to prepare for their wedding, yet Jesus didn't criticise them for poor planning. He came to their aid and met their need. And He will do the same for us; all we have to do is invite Him.
- 2) Secondly, we need to do what He tells us, even when we don't understand it. Faith does not require explanations. It requires simple obedience and trusting in the goodness of God. 'Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you your heart's desires. Commit everything you do to the LORD. Trust him, and he will help you.' (Psalm 37:4-5 NLT).
- 3) Finally, understand that God can save the best for the last. 'But you have kept the best until now!' (John 2:10 NLT). It's not too late. What looks to us like a tragedy can become a testimony of God's goodness and faithfulness in our lives too.

What a privilege it is for us to be here to witness the confirmation of these candidates today!

Anyone who turns up at church brings their own story with them. For many it is a story of God's surprising intervention in their life – stilling storms of various kinds, Jesus being present in times of fear or failure, restoring hope and confidence for the future. The account of Jesus stilling the storm is followed by the story of Jesus healing two men who were deeply troubled – demonised, whether by trauma, or sickness, or something else.

For some of us, the storms are external – as we face circumstances beyond our control we find ourselves using that most familiar prayer of all – the one that just says HELP!!!!

For others the storms are internal, and terrifying, as was the case for the two mentioned in our gospel reading. We often don't appreciate the internal struggles others have, and when we realise it can come as a shock to us.

Whatever the storm, God promises to be with us in Jesus, and to see us through. In Jesus we have both the promise of his presence with us always, and the hope of life in all its fullness both now and in eternity.

People often say that religion and spirituality is a personal thing. They are right if they mean that it matters deeply to them as individuals. But it is much more than that. Our reading from Ephesians speaks of our one Father 'from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name.' Those confirmed into the family of God today join a community of peoples and nations where all are siblings together. There is no such thing as a solo Christian – we are a community, joined together in Christ by the Holy Spirit.

Together we have far more power than we imagine to make a difference in the world. Far more power to extend the reach of God's kingdom of justice and peace – far more power to make the love of God real in practical ways for people everywhere. Faced with the problems of today's world people often ask, 'But what can I do?' The problems seem immense, and we feel so powerless to make a difference. But we are not – we have the power, given by God through Jesus, and vibrant among us in the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Those being confirmed tonight, and all of us at All Saints and St John's, as well as those visiting in support of the candidates, are invited simply to receive that gift - and to be ready to face the changes this will bring. Watch this space... and see what God will do in us, among us, and through us day by day.

Vanillekipferl

(vanilla-flavoured crescent-shaped shortbread cookies)

Ingredients

- ❖ 5oz. Flour
- ❖ 3oz. Butter
- ❖ 2oz. Ground almonds,
Hazelnuts or Walnuts
- ❖ 6oz. Vanilla flavoured sugar
- ❖ Pinch of Salt

Method:

1. Sift flour on to the working surface
2. Add 1oz. sugar and all other ingredients
3. Cut the firm cold butter into small pieces
4. Work all together to a smooth paste
5. Leave for ½ hour in cool place
6. Shape into crescents
7. Cook on ungreased baking sheet (gas mark 4/180°C) until pale golden colour
8. Put remaining sugar on a plate and roll kipferl while still hot in the sugar

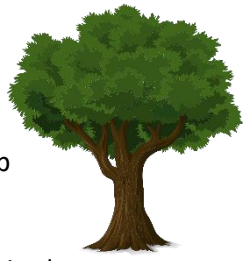
