The Life Of Champions' School - So Far

Our joint MA service on the 29th December this year took on a rather different flavour. We hosted the visit of Sandra Noon the Founder and Trust secretary of FKC (Friends of Kenya's Children) who gave an overview of how the work in the slums of Eldoret started back on 2006 and what it has achieved since then, in spite of many challenges.

For those unaware she explained how the visionary local Paster, Kenneth Kimeu saw such a need to support and educate the young people from the slum area of Eldoret, which his church served and how he had built and developed Champion's School with the financial help of FKC and its supporters. She effusively thanked our two Mickleover churches for their regular financial contributions and the involvement of those who had been such valuable supporters to the Trust over many years.

There were many graphic pictures of the stages in the construction of the school from the bare unused plot of land in 2006, to the school which exists today. Much progress was made until the Riots in 2010, illustrated on video. These arose from the general tension following the Kenyan Government's imposition of a new Tax. The School building proved vulnerable and was badly damaged from break-ins. A security audit highlighted the urgent need for a substantial wall to surround and protect the school premises. This proved very effective in preventing further damage or break-ins.

Sandra highlighted the significant achievements of providing running water from the two wells drilled in 2019 and the installation of Solar Panels on the roofs, which gives a free consistent electrical supply. These improvements enabled another major step in 2023 when the soil toilets and Cess tanks were replaced by an Ablution block connected to the recently installed town drains. This was completed in the school's annual shutdown in December and January when the students are normally on holiday at home. A very poignant observation was made through a picture of some of the orphan students who had requested to stay in school to help with the construction; they said they preferred being at Champions rather than returning to their 'basic' tribal home villages where they would not be so welcome or comfortable!

Champion's student life was illustrated through a variety of pictures showing teachers working with their students, some on computers, preparing for the curriculum in the 'Home Economics' and 'Science' Laboratories. These two new facilities were arranged to meet the legal obligations of being a Junior High School, which was achieved before the commencement of the 2024 academic year. It was good to see how the famous laptops and tablets were being so well used to meet the governments detailed annual curriculum. It was also interesting to note how their Department for Education carry out regular scrutiny visits of the School's operations, one recent result of this was them declaring 'Champions' the best Junior High School in the area.

A different experience for the students was shown as they went on their 'School tour' (our School Trip), this is now mandatory in their curriculum. They witnessed some wild animals in a Hotel's Safari Park; swimming and messing around in a Water Park which opened their minds to aspects of life previously unknown. The School and parents can't afford trips further afield, but they do the best they can.

2024 was a traumatic year as many challenges faced Champions and FKC. Initially Paster Kenneth was struck with a serious bout of Malaria for two months, then the floods came, destroying so many homes, businesses and livelihoods of the parents and local residents. Amidst this another poignant account was given of a young student called *Mercyline*, she had become seriously ill and needed major surgery to save her life. FKC were asked if they could help, which they did. Photographs which her Mother had taken were shown, when she was seriously ill in hospital, then having a scan and entering the Operating Theatre, then recovering. Thankfully she is now fully recovered and back studying. The whole operation and aftercare cost just £500! A little different from what it would have cost in the UK, but illustrating how FKC's money was well spent.

Further mention was made of the third major challenge of 2024, when the floods inundated the school, causing so much damage to all areas. It was a reminder of how crisis keep occurring but then being able to observe the amazing responses. The damage from the floods was significant, so Kenneth told the trustees the projected cost of repairs before the October 2024 AGM, this was shared with those at the meeting without any suggestions of contributions being needed. A supporter who was present quietly wrote a cheque and handed it to Sandra after the meeting to cover the entire cost. Miracles continue to happen, Praise God!

In light of these many challenges, it was explained that progress on the Vocational Skills Centre, introduced at St Johns at the 2023 AGM by Kenneth, had been postponed, but will be started in early 2025.

The final video shown was of the last day of term, of students enjoying their lunch and then a younger class performing on a stage with their teacher. Although it was difficult to hear, the children were singing "I am a child. I am me. You are you. We are special". Hear! Hear!

It was such a suitable ending to an inspirational overview of what can be achieved by a Charity we support.

We were reminded of our Lord saying, "I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!"
