Luke 10:39-end. Mary & Martha

Hospitality was very important in the biblical world, it was actually part of their culture. It particularly shows up very strongly in Lukes's gospel.

Hospitality was also important in our household as I was growing up. Especially at Christmas, Easter and birthdays. I can see my mother now busying herself with all the preparations, things had to be right and proper. A little like Martha in our reading from Luke.

I suppose in the end hospitality is an art. Making sure guests are welcomed, warmed and well-fed. Requires a great deal of creativity, organisation and teamwork. Mary and her sister were probably one of the best hospitality teams in the whole of the bible and of course one of their frequent guests was Jesus.

In the opening scene Jesus comes to Bethany and to the home of Lazarus, Mary and Martha. A place where Jesus could unwind and relax with his friends. Martha demonstrates hospitality by welcoming Jesus, then starts to busy herself by preparing a meal and serving her guest.

Meanwhile her sister Mary sits at Jesus' feet listening to His words. Rather than assuming the role expected of a woman in her culture. We read that Mary sat at the feet of Jesus listening to His every word. She actually assumes the posture of a student learning at the feet of a Rabbi, which was a role reserved for men.

This story now takes a sharp turn in proceedings when Martha distracted by her many tasks, comes to Jesus and asks "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself"? Tell her then to help me.

Jesus replies, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing, Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her".

Martha found it hard to relax and enjoy her guests, she found it even harder to accept Mary's lack of cooperation. Martha's as we have seen was frustrated by the situation so asks Jesus to settle the matter.

Jesus gently corrected her attitude showed that her priorities were good but not the best. Personal attention to her guest would have been more important than the comforts she tried to provide for them. Martha's worry and efforts to please prevented her from being truly present with Jesus. In fact it probably caused a rift between the two sisters. Martha needed to listen to the words of Jesus and to know that she was valued not for what she does but for who she is, as a child of God.

Martha in fact breaks all the rules of hospitality by trying to embarrass her sister Mary in front of her guest. To make matters worse she asks her guest, Jesus, to intervene

in a family dispute. She even tries to accuse Jesus of not caring by saying, "Lord, do you not care....?"

Martha needed to just step back take a deep breath, stop worrying and receive the gracious presence of Jesus, listen to His words and know that she is valued.

Many of us I think can identify with Martha. The business of life, feeling pulled in different directions, feeling worried and distracted. We all know that worrying does no good at all and I suppose what we worry about is not so important in the larger scheme of things.

Listen and doing, receiving God's word and serving others is fundamental and vital to the life of every Christian, just as inhaling and exhaling are to breathing. Trying to serve God and others without being nourished by God's word is like expecting good fruit to grow from a tree that has been chopped down.

Lukes's story ends rather abruptly, we don't really know what happened next, were Mary and Martha reconciled, were they able to enjoy the meal Martha had prepared. Did Martha finally sit and give her full attention to Jesus? What type of hospitality does Jesus receive in your life? Are you so busy running your life that you neglect time with Jesus?

But we do know that Jesus invites all of us who find life hard or who are worried and distracted to come to Him. To hear words of grace and truth, to know that we to are valued and loved. We need God to renew and strengthen us for service. There is only one thing we can do and that is to sit at the feet of Jesus our guest and as it turns out our guest is also our host. Jesus wants to give us all an abundance of gifts so that we can be effective in prayer and service. So can we be like Mary and listen to our Lord as we read our bibles and perform tasks of hospitality and service, which is so vital in making the church in our modern world a welcoming community.
