Advent Sunday Readings - Romans 13:11-14, Matthew 24:36-44

We are in the season of Advent again, and amid the excitement and anticipation there may also be an element of panic! We return to the story of Christ coming to earth incarnate – fully human and fully divine - and we are reminded of the truth of this again through the Old Testament prophets and the story of Jesus' birth. Our readings in this season take us to another place too, that of looking forward and anticipating the return of Christ (the second coming). Jesus has to remind his disciples and all of us not to try to predict when this will happen, indeed Jesus says that he does not know that himself. Paul in Romans also encourages his readers to both anticipate and live in hope and constant awareness that the darkness will end one day and the light will come.

Anticipation. As the person who does safeguarding training for a living, it would be a wonderful surprise if people anticipated safeguarding training sessions with joy and happiness.... but that's not usually the case! Even though Jesus makes clear that the day and the hour of his return, and the 'rapture' when some go and some are left, are not known, still people try to predict this event. The Revd William Miller in the USA got tens of thousands of followers to believe that October 22 1844 would see Christ return...and this was followed by what became known as 'the great disappointment'! A former NASA engineer published a bestselling book predicting the rapture to be in 1989...then 1993...then 1994! Even in the year 2000 we had people predicting Jesus would return and computers would crash...but he didn't come and they didn't crash! Anticipation in this Advent season is right, but it shouldn't dominate our thinking. Instead let's adopt godly anticipation into our lives and lifestyles.

Adoption. We are to adopt into our thinking and our beliefs the reality that Jesus will return but not get obsessed by the anticipation at the cost of everything else. Likewise, we are to adopt our attitudes to what we do to care for and safeguard others in the church community into our ways of being and serving. Paul calls the Romans to 'wake up', and look to the hope we have been given, even in this challenging and dark world. As Jesus' disciples we are never without hope and in adopting an anticipation of Christ's return into our lives we will become a safer and healthier community.

Action. As a result of all this Paul calls the Romans to action. They are to put aside darkness and sin, behave decently, kindly and fairly in how they treat others, respect others and put aside any behaviour and habits that are not Godly.

The people are to live in unity and generosity, avoid jealousy, and respect and encourage the gifts that each of us have. These ways of being are all about safeguarding – living out our call to be a community of honesty, openness, care, and love. This is the mission of the church – a collection of people called by God to actively live for Jesus and to live for him.

So, as we move through Advent and remember Jesus coming that first time, we anticipate, adopt and put love, care and safety into action with the sure knowledge that there is hope, and Christ will return one day. 'Keep watch, for we do not know the day or the hour that the Lord will come'...and in the waiting, 'we clothe ourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ.'
